

We call for a **radical extension of democracy on the Council**. We want to see the big decisions about our future made by the elected Council and **not by unelected boards**.

We believe that we **need a campaign** for massive government investment to **create jobs, build public housing, develop our public transport system, expand the university and support public services**.
